- Notify your education provider of your Australian address within 7 days of arriving and within 7 days of any change
- Notify the Department of Home Affairs of any changes to your circumstances

- Payment of one semester's tuition fees is due upon acceptance of your Letter of Offer
- OSHC, accommodation, and airport pickup fees (if applicable) are due upon acceptance
