Recognition Of Prior Learning (RPL) & Credit Transfer (CT)

Students may apply for Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) if they have relevant and current work or life experience and consider they are able to meet the unit of competency requirements and/or Credit Transfer may be granted to eligible applicants against the relevant unit/s of competency when evidence of the student having successfully completed the same unit of competency in an equivalent or higher nationally endorsed qualification.

Certification

On successful completion of all the required outcomes for each chosen unit of competency for this course, students will be awarded a Prisma Education Institute Australia (PEIA) Certificate for: SIT50422 Diploma of Hospitality Management including an Academic Record.

Students who have not achieved competency in all chosen units of competency for this qualification, will be issued a Statement of Attainment for those units of competency that they have successfully achieved competence in.

Students who do not successfully complete the course will be issued a SOA for the units in which they have been competent.
